Self-Portrail. Based on "Description of a Picture" by Heiner Müller Director: Madeleine Loayza.

A scenic-performative work based on Description of a Picture by Heiner Müller.

Inspired by "Description of a Picture" by Heiner Müller, the team of actors, dramaturg, and director assumes the role of the voice describing the painting, repainting it through their sensitive experience. This work confronts an intimate writing style that generates powerful visual images, laden with "humors" and memories appropriated by the team involved. The research-creation process challenges a complex writing style, seemingly indecipherable and impossible to stage, while simultaneously captivating through a register of confusion, horror, and uncertainty.

Müller's writing demands embodiment in the actors' bodies to transform into a lived experience for the audience. The dramaturgies of this painting appear infinite, interpreted as repainting or copying a forgery, based on an extinct dramatic structure. This structure no longer exists as such, where the explosion through memory highlights its arbitrary nature, giving way to the voices narrating the crime, the central theme of this proposal.

The scenic dramaturgy evolves with each encounter with the audience. Intertextuality, pastiche, synthetic fragments, the rupture with causal narratives, and other techniques provide relevant experiences to the research and dissemination of this proposal.

Madeleine Loayza Director

PhD in Arts: Production and Research, from the Universitat Politècnica de València, Spain. Master's in Art Studies; Diploma in Theater Direction, and a Bachelor's in Acting. She stands out as a director and research professor. Her doctoral research and artistic production focus on theatricality, the body, and contemporary dramaturgies, as an actress-performer and director-dramaturg. Her stage proposals—Crime and Punishment, Description of a Picture, The Tempest, and Rapture Opus 52—have won national awards, generated articles, and lectures at universities in and outside Latin America: UCE (Ecuador), Mar del Plata (ATEACOMP-Argentina), UNLP (La Plata-Argentina), U. de Antioquia (Medellín-Colombia), U. Caldas (Manizales-Colombia), Red CITU (Colombia), AITU (Russia), Ibero-American Association of Arts and Letters (AIBAL), Faculty of Humanities and Letters (UNMSM), Department of Spanish & Portuguese Studies of the University of Minnesota, and the Institute of Performing Arts of UBA.

She is an editor-compiler and author of several books and articles related to academia and performing arts. A tenured professor at the Performing Arts Program of FAUCE, she coordinated the 1st International Congress on Theater Pedagogy, FAUCE 2017, and the Research Master's in Direction and Contemporary Dramaturgies (MIDDC) 2022. Her work has been awarded the Central University of Ecuador's highest honor three times: in 2020, for the book Portrait of a Woman with Oranges (faculty category); in 2019, for Rapture Opus 52, a creation and direction process under her guidance (student category); and in 2018, for the research-creation project Description of a Picture (faculty category).

Currently, she is preparing Woman in Flames, a hybrid dramaturgy where she assumes the roles of actress, dramaturg/director-researcher. She is part of the design team for the Doctorate in Arts and a member of the Performing Arts Program Council at FAUCE.

- •The show is recommended for a space of small format, the public is placed in the room shaped like horse shoe, like a "U" preferably on a surface of 6m x 8m or for an audience of 30 people.
- White backdrop for projection.
- Scenery-props

- •Frames 7 (50 x 35 cm). Frame 8 (55 x 40cm).


